-Use to be to talk about name, age, adjectives, jobs, nationality and more.

-This is the verb **to be** in the **present tense**.

l am	I am Peter.
You are	You are 18.
He / she / it is	He / she / it is friendly.
We are	We are Japanese.
You are	You are students.
They are	They are a family.



You are	\longrightarrow	You 're
He / she / it is	\rightarrow	He 's / she 's / it 's
We are	\longrightarrow	We 're
You are	\rightarrow	You 're
They are	\longrightarrow	They 're
